Rod is a retired paediatric anaesthetist who has maintained a longstanding interest in anaesthesia history. He was a consultant at the Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne for 31 years, 20 as Deputy Director.

He has recently retired after 25 years as the Honorary Curator of the Geoffrey Kaye Museum of Anaesthetic History at the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists in Melbourne.

He was President of the Australian Society of Anaesthetists from 1998 to 2000 and a member of College Council from 1995 to 2007. He is a Life Member of the Society. Together with Christine Bell he has written historical cover notes for each issue of the journal "Anaesthesia and Intensive Care" since February 1989.
