A practical approach to performance improvement

Clinicians and allied professionals are always looking for ways to bring about improvement in care delivery in their local settings. This workshop is designed to provide delegates with the background knowledge and skills for making changes to improve performance, raise standards and address safety issues.

Participants will be taught how to use the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) Model for Improvement, a simple but powerful framework, and they will be given a few practical tools to address identifiable gaps in the quality of care that they provide.

The workshop includes a number of small group exercises with a focus on the key elements of improvement work such as: setting goals, developing ideas for change, implementing tests of change, key measurement concepts and how to go about creating a culture for improvement.
